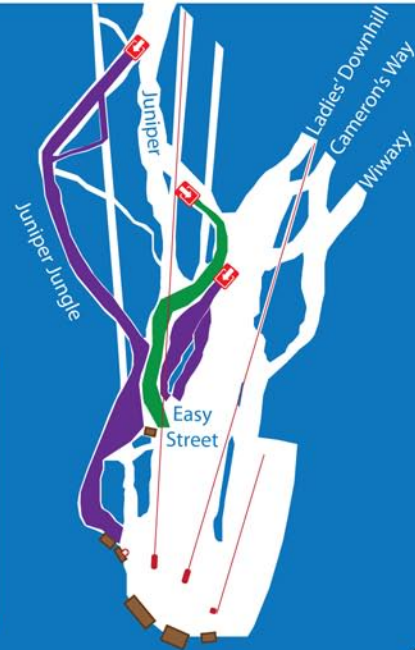

The Lake Louise Ski Area has it all! The world-class terrain is both vast and varied, the wilderness is pristine and inspirational, and spectacular Rocky Mountain views appear at every turn. With 4,200 skiable acres, Lake Louise is one of the largest ski areas in North America. Beginner and intermediate skiers will find an abundance of gentle slopes and long cruising runs. Experts can explore endless chutes, glades, gullies, and remote bowls in some of the Rockies' most challenging terrain.

Three Day Lodges, Seven Food and Beverage Options

Lake Louise offers three distinct day lodges located strategically throughout the ski area, so food and shelter are never far away. The base area's Lodge of the Ten Peaks and Whiskyjack Lodge feature the North Face Bistro, the Great Bear Restaurant, the Powder Keg Lounge, a cafeteria, and a Starbucks coffee bar. On the backside of Louise, Temple Lodge features a cafeteria, BBQ sundeck, and our rustic restaurant, Sawyer's Nook.

Directly adjacent to the base of the Glacier Chair, the Kokanee Kabin is the perfect place to enjoy your après! Whether you're looking for a hot coffee or a refreshing pint of beer, the Kokanee Kabin can serve you. Look for our BBQ and live music in the spring!

Daycare

Open from 8:30am to 4:30pm, no child is too small to enjoy Lake Louise! The cozy nursery has unique, fully accredited facilities to care for babies as young as eighteen days old. Our protected Wilderness Adventure Park is complete with the Magic Carpet lift that provides a safe and secure environment for those all-important introductions to winter fun. Three and four year olds can combine daycare with the Kinder Ski program. The Lake Louise Daycare is located next to the Lodge of the Ten Peaks.



Great Divide Lodge

The Great Divide Lodge, located just inside the BC border at the summit of the famous Kicking Horse Pass in Yoho National Park, overlooks beautiful Wapta Lake and is just 17km (10mi) west of Lake Louise. Features include a licensed restaurant, lounge, gift shop, free Wi-Fi internet, free parking, and a free ski shuttle.



You can choose either a standard guest room or spacious suite in the main lodge. Suites have two queen beds or one queen bed plus a pull-out sofa bed, and some have fireplaces. Ask for a room with a view/balcony overlooking Wapta Lake, and about our frequent "Stay and Ski" packages at great rates.
